TL: Um, I'm gonna say everything's doing good with me, I'm just taking one day at a time.

RH: OK.

JB: Are you getting support from mental health?

TL: Um, yeah. I just saw mental health yesterday.

TL: Um, she was nice, I talked to her for a little bit and then I was on my way. Cause when I come from court I don't necessarily don't like to talk to these people because I think I'm fine. Like I don't need to talk to anybody.

JB: But if your ever never fine, I want you to talk to somebody.

TL: Yeah.

JB: It's ok to talk to somebody, OK.

TL: Yeah. I know that.

JB: I think you could handle it.

TL: M-hmm.

JB: Alright, so congrats again...

TL: Thank you.

JB: At the birth of your new girl. What's her name?

TL:

JB: Oh, that's a pretty name.

RH: Very nice. TL: Thank you.

RH: How do you spell that?

RH: Now is that...

JB: Rose. TL: Rose.

RH: My daughters middle name is Rose.

JB: That's pretty. I like that,

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RH: That's nice.

JB: What's the meaning of I

RH: Oh wow.

JB: Oh.

TL: I just spelt it differently.

JB: OK.

RH: That's fantastic, nice.

TL: I just spelt it completely differently cause I didn't like the way it was spelled.

RH: Yeah.

TL: So, I wanted to be unique with the way I spell it.

JB: It's pretty, yeah.

RH: Yeah.

because my daughter came in the world as heaven so I call her my TL: It's supposed to be meaning, heaven little heaven. My little peanut. That's my little baby right there. I love her.

JB: So how is she doing?

TL: Um, she's doing really good. Um, she was in the hospital for two weeks.

JB: M-hmm.

TL: Um, since the day of my birth and she got released yesterday to my mother.

TL: My mother got granted to take her.

TL: The lawyer came to the house, checked the house again to make sure the baby was good. Everything was fine in the house. Um, she went to court up here in New London and they granted her...

JB: Custody.

TL: ...custody, temporary custody until I could come home.

JB: M-hmm.

TL: Um, so on that part everything is doing good. She's doing well. She's roughly about to be 5lbs. She's gaining it, losing it, so, um, they took the feeding tube off of her, so that's how she got released because eventually, um, initially she wasn't drinking from the bottle and she was really small. And she still is really small, but not too small. Like she can't be home.



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TL: So, she gained weight. They took the feeding tube off. She's drinking, pooping. She's doing everything she has to do so they released her and now she's home with my mother and I went to court yesterday and I guess, um, they asked for, my public defender asked for a [??] bed. But the judge denied it because of my charges. Um, so it was kind of disappointing to me so at that moment I did need someone to talk to but when I came back I was like, eh I'm over it.

TL: So, um, the discipline became because I'm, like, its tiring being here. I can't say that and the way I was treated at that point when I gave birth. I don't like it and its uncomfortable for me because I not a day go by that I don't think that something could have happened to my daughter and something could have happened to me. So, but there's not a day that goes by that I don't thank god that something didn't happen to her and something didn't happen to me. And, another thing that's uncomfortable for me because I'm walking around the whole compound and the whole compound is like, asking me questions. Telling me more rumors, making me relive the situation when I don't want to relive it.

RH: M-hmm.

TL: So, it's like I'm just had it being here because I'm the walk and talk around here and I don't want to be the walk and talk around here. It feels...

RH: Well...

TL: ...it feels good to me because I didn't something good.

TL: But, I don't like reliving what I did good because I wasn't supposed to be in that situation.

TL: Whether it was locked down Tuesday or not.

RH: Sure. I apologize for having to make you go through this again, but I will just say we are in charge of investigating why this happened to you.

JB: Yes.

TL: M-hmm.

RH: So that why we are here. So.

TL: No, that's fine.

JB: So, are you ok talking to us about it?

TL: Yeah. That's fine. You guys I could talk to, but...

JB: OK. OK.

RH: Yeah.

TL: You guys are investigators so I have no choice but to talk about it this.



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JB: So, I'm glad that you made a segway into what happened. So, I'm going to ask you please tell me what happened from Tuesday, February 6 when you saw the doctor to Tuesday, February 13 when you delivered your baby. TL: OK. Um, Tuesday I don't really remember a lot of stuff Tuesday because that was Tuesday.

JB: Right.

RH: Yeah. If, as your talking, if something, oh wait, and this happened...

JB: Yeah.

RH: ...beforehand...

B: It's ok.

RH: ...you can go back and forth.

JB: Just freestyle.

TL: Alright, so, I talk to her Tuesday, I'm remembering that because when I went, I don't even remember what day it was, but I know I went over there and I'm guessing its Tuesday. Um so I went over there, I went to medical...

TL: ...and I told her that I was having, um, braxton hicks contractions at the time. Because that's what I was having at the time.

TL: But I didn't, I didn't come to her with those words because I didn't know what braxton hicks was at the time so, so I came to her and said to her I was having pain. And it was, like, back pain.

TL: And she said to me are they coming every 15 minutes, are they coming every 5 minutes or how many, how many minutes are they coming. It's hard to tell how many minutes they are coming because were locked in the cell. We, I don't have a watch in my room. And they come every 15 minutes. I'm not gonna sit here and count how many minutes I'm having pain cause that's hard to do when you're in pain...

TL: ...so, I told her, I said honestly don't know. But I know they come like, I told her every half hour. Because they come every 15 minutes and that's how many times I was having the pain, its every half hour.

JB: Who came every 15 minutes.

TL: The C-O's came...



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JB: OK. So, your using that...

TL: ...tour, yeah, using that. Cause they do the tour around every 15 minutes. So, um, then she said to me when they get, when they get, 5 every 15 minutes, let me know and you can come back. She gave me a pitcher of ice and told me to drink water cause when usually you don't drink water and you have braxton hicks contractions that's what causes it for you to not have when you don't have water in your system. Your body naturally contracts cause you don't have fluids in your body. So, I said to her, alright that's fine. I wasn't in that much pain that time. But then a couple days I don't remember the other days I went there because I was, I don't even remember...

JB: All I want, so did you go every day or, because I have parts missing. Days missing that you didn't, that you didn't have pain.

TL: No, I, I...

JB: Or did you have pain every day?

TL: ... I had every other day that I went.

JB: OK.

TL: It wasn't like all the time I had pain. It was like every other day.

TL: Um, so then, the, the next, the very other, following day, I went again because I was having pains but it was, it was every, I'm gonna say like every 20 minutes. She said 15 minutes to let her know, but at 20 minutes I'm freaking out because...

RH: Yeah.

TL: ... I don't know. So ...

TL: Yeah, so, I told her that I was having pain again, all they kept doing was giving me ice cold water and that's all they kept doing for me. Telling me to drink water, drink water, drink water. And then, nurse Jess, she was ready to send me out to the hospital, but I told her...

TL: Nurse Jess. She was ready to send me out to the hospital but I told her that I don't think I'm going to have the baby because that day I didn't feel like I was gonna have her. So, she said, you're not having the baby today so your good. And I said, yeah and I appreciate all the help that she does. Because she's usually one of the nurses that really care for me and help me a lot. So, I told her thank you for everything because all them days that I saw her she was the one that cared the most and did everything that she had to do. Then, um, I don't really remember the rest of the days because I was in tragic mode.

TL: I don't really remember, so. The day come to Febr--, the day comes like Tuesday, um...



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TL: ...before. No, actually I'm gonna say Monday night, cause Monday night we were on lock cause of a code. And I went to my room and I was having pains since the morning time. And I told that, I told one of the C-Os, um, that I don't really remember the C-Os name but I told one of them, I said that I'm, there's, I'm having discharge leaking from me.

JB: So, Monday you were starting to leak?

TL: Yeah, but, I, I honestly thought it was my mucus plug because my mucus plug haven't came out yet. So, I told them, I think my mucus plug is coming out and they, they started laughing at me and said, um,...

RH: Who was laughing?

TL: One of the C-Os, I don't know their name.

TL: I just knew they were laughing, but I think they thought I was playing around or something so I don't think they were laughing purposely. But they started laughing and I said, mister, im being serious cause I'm discharging and I have a pad on. And that's not, I don't know if that's normal. So, she called the nurse and the nurse said that it was, I forgot her name, but, it was somebody. And she said, the nurse said, that's discharging is fine, that means her mucus plug is coming out. She'll be ok. And I said ok that's fine with me, as long as I'm ok. So, I, I eventually then was having like, the contractions but I wasn't having them like, I wasn't necessarily say every 15 minutes, they were just like pelvis pains that I was having and I don't know if that's contractions but I was having them. Cause they told me if you have contractions they get tight in your stomach and you get tight down there and everywhere.

JB: Do you know what time Monday the, you were having the discharge?

TL: Um, I'm gonna say around 1:00. I'm gonna say around morning time and...

TL: one o'clock. All that day I was having it and to eventually at night time, like around I'm gonna say 10, 9, 11, around there. I'm gonna say like 10 when third shift comes in. I, um, I said to them, I, I actually was, I forgot what I was doing, I buzzed them and said I was having pain and third shift Ortiz with the nice eyes came and he was and he was like alright come up Laboy, so I came up and he said his gonna call the nurse. He called the nurse and told them she's crying in pain and she's 8 months pregnant and he told them the details of everything and then eventually they brought me over. I'm gonna say 10 minutes later they brought me over.

JB: To medical?

TL: To medical, yeah, um, not outpatients medical. Third shift medical, like where the medical [??]

TL: So, they brought me over there and Maddox, I think her name is Maddox, C-O Maddox. She said to me are you having the baby Laboy and smiled at me and I said, I laughed. She's one of my favorite C-Os because she's always, she's so caring and genuine.

Metal Investigator:



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TL: She was working in medical at the time so I, I asked her, I said, I said to her I think so, but, but I didn't get to finish my sentence because the nurse, nurse Michelle had interrupt me and said oh she's not having the baby, she's fine. And did it with an attitude and I looked at her and I said how would you know I'm fine by my face.

JB: Did nurse Michelle, did you tell her about leaking the fluids and stuff...

TL: I did tell her everything. And she said that's probably your mucus plug or something like that. And I just looked at her like, I don't know what's going on, but it was frustrating me. So then, like around I'm going to say 10:30 they sent me back with, she checked the fetal, um, the baby's heartbeat and she checked, um, my blood pressure. She gave me a heated pad and some water and told me to go back, I was fine. So, when I went back I started having the bloody show when your pregnant, Like when you give birth it's like a bloody show that you have.

RH: Can I ask you, when you went over there, did she do anything kind of exam?

TL: No, she's telling everybody she did, but she didn't.

TL: I don't think the nurses are supposed to do an exam unless they have a Doctor around. That's what I was told by the Commissioner.

TL: So, she did not do an exam, she didn't do anything to check if I was dilated or nothing. And you supposed to sent to the hospital to do any of that from my understanding.

JB: Did you hear her call the doctor?

TL: She didn't call anybody, she just sent me back. So, I don't understand, what, how's that possible for her to do any of that and lie about it. And then, and then she um, and then after that she, I went to, um, I went back to the unit and the unit and they eventually was in still in pain for like a couple of hours and then like an hour later I started leaking, like a lot. It was a lot of water coming out of me. I told my Bunkie to buzz em cause I couldn't get up from the toilet. It was a lot of water. And I told her buzz them cause I think my water broke and she said and she said ok I got you. So, she buzzed them and said I think my Bunkie water broke. And she said her water, the C-Os came down and was like so what exactly is going on now. Like said it just like that and I said my water, I think my water broke but I'm not sure it's my water. I said it just like that cause I wasn't sure.

TL: And then she said and then the C-Os, the C-O said I'm gonna call the nurse. So, she went up did her tour real quick, went up called the nurse and the nurse, she came back down and the nurse said your fine. That's your mucus plug. She had it set in her mind that it was the mucus plug. But, I'm telling you my water broke. You should have some type of consideration that my water broke.

JB: The mucus plug isn't not supposed to move unless you're about to give birth.

TL: Exactly.



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JB: Yeah.

TL: So, that's what I'm saying, is she should know that by delivering babies. You know what I'm saying?

TL: And so, um, then after that, um, I'm gonna say like around, I put a shirt on cause the pads wasn't working it was going through my pads, it was going through everything. So, I put a shirt down there, one of my burgundy shirts cause I don't like [??] in my white shirts. So, I used my burgundy shirt. And so I put it down there and, um, when I, I walked to the chow how because it was time to chow hall. And I'm thinking now...

RH: M-hmm.

TL: I'm not actively...

JB: So, you were able to walk?

TL: I was able to walk but I couldn't walk. Like...

TL: I was, in a lot of pain, I couldn't walk, like my legs kept giving in every single time I was walking to the chow hall. And, so, I couldn't even eat my breakfast cause my hands were like this, like they were numb. Everything was numb in my body and I couldn't eat anything, I tried eating, I was snapping at everyone at the table. My mom goes like yup, you were in active labor girl cause you snappin at everybody. I was like I'm not trying to snap at anybody, I'm just in a lot of pain. Nobody is doing anything about it. So, then I came, I went back to the tier and I'm gonna say like around 6 o'clock, I took the shirt out and it was like blood clots and all of them. There was a lot of blood and there was a blood clot on the floor and I didn't know my bunkie went to step over it and was like what is this. So, she turned the light on and she's like oh my god Bunkie. And then, it made her nervous so she buzzed them and she said listen, my, my bunkie is having a bloody show. So y'all need to call the nurse. So, they came down and the nurse was like, they kept, they had it set in their mind that I was fine, that I was fine that I was and I was fine, and I kept telling them I'm not fine. Right. There's blood coming out of me. Like around 6:30 I started, body started naturally pushing and I was on the toilet and because I thought I honestly...

JB: Why use the toilet?

TL: ... I had, yeah, I thought I had to use the bathroom.

TL: So, I was pushing, pushing, so I put my hands down there because I wanted to see if I was dilating or nothing. I was smart about that because anything could have happened after that point. But I was smart because my mom told me that if anything happens, put your hand down there and see if your dilated. But, but...

TL: My mom told me this, so, I put my hand in there and I felt her head. It was, she was crowning, I felt her whole head.

So, I pushed and I pushed twice and she came out. And then...

JB: And did you hold her after she go in the toilet?

TL: She didn't go into the toilet at all.



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JB: OK. You held her.

TL: I, I held her before ...

RH: OK.

TL: ...she could fall in the toilet.

JB: OK.

TL: So, when she, when she, I'm gonna say she fell a little bit but I'm not gonna say like her whole body did...

JB: M-hmm.

TL: It was like...

JB: Because you were holding her.

TL: I was holding her...

TL: ...so she was like tilted in there, but she didn't fall exactly in there, I'm not gonna say that. So, then the C-Os was doing her tour, we buzzed them and they heard the baby in the buzzer.

JB: So, the baby was crying I guess? TL: Yeah. The baby was not reacting at that point but then when I buzzed them right away they heard, wah, wah and they came down and said oh my god, there is a baby in the cell. So, they called, one of the C-Os called a code white, and then everybody came and it was, that's, everybody came and did what they had to do. The nurse Diane and the nurse Michelle and I said to her I told you so, I told you so and she was like I know, I know and all the nurses looked at her like, you knew. I was like I told you so and you didn't believe me...

RH: M-hmm.

TL: ... I was getting mad, because she didn't believe me.

RH: M-hmm.

TL: And I feel like as a person if, I'm coming to you with like exact thoughts and you don't believe me...

TL: ...and I'm telling you the exact thoughts that I'm having then you should be able to have some consideration to try to believe me. Don't just keep denying my needs and stuff cause at that point you putting your job in jeopardy and putting my life in risk, know what I'm saying?

TL: And it wasn't, I don't think it was appropriate at that time, because she could have kept me in medical, even if I had the baby there, I was at least I was in medical...

Thetal Investigator:



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RH: Yeah.

TL: ...with a whole bunch of Doctors and Nurses.

RH: have you ever had a problem with her before?

TL: I don't even know who this lady is...

RH: So ...

TL: I just know her by...

RH: Nurse Michelle.

TL: Newspaper, it said Michelle on there. So, I don't even know.

RH: But you never had an argument with her?

TL: I never had...

RH: She never had, OK. So, there's...

JB: So, the newspaper named her?

TL No, not, no, Liza, Liza or Ruez that's on my tier, she knows her name.

RH: OK.

JB: OK.

TL: She told me her name.

TL: I said, that's her name. Cause I never heard of her before.

RH: OK.

TL: So, they said that's her name, Michelle. But I don't honestly know any of these people in here because I'm not trying to get to comfortable here.

RH: Yeah.

JB: So, prior to that you had no problems with medical?

TL: I never had a problem with medical before.

TL: Until recently, I think they got tired of seeing me too much, that's really what it was. I was coming there like a couple times a week so they were getting tired of seeing me.

RH: But your 8 months pregnant.

TL: Exactly.



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JB: Why were you going there...

TL: Nah I'm gonna say like a couple that week that...

JB: Yes, you were, yeah.

TL: I was going there and I think they got tired...

JB: But you had a reason to go there.

TL: Yeah, exactly. But they got tired of seeing me. And I don't know why, I'm 8 months pregnant, I mean you should.

TL: You should not be able to get tired to see me. Know what I'm saying, so.

JB: I'm so sorry that it was your first baby and it was a bad experience.

TL: Hmm, its ok, it's not ok but, I'm, you know I'm learning that life is, everything is for a reason and I'm a strong woman of god, you know what I'm saying. So, god does things for reasons and there's really nothing you can do to go back, just move forward. You know what I'm saying, so, it's not like something that's I relive all the time, but I relive it like when I, I, like get sad or something. So, it looks like, it's hard for me, it's hard, but I live day by day and I just do what I gotta do to be there for my daughter.

JB: M-hmm.

TL: And that's all I can do for her.

RH: Do you have any complaints about any of the Officers that were working that night?

TL: No, I don't have no complaints about them. They were actually doing everything they had to do.

RH: OK.

TL: Everything they had to do.

TL: Ortiz was coming down like every 5 minutes checking on me, buzzing my door...

TL: ... everything, he was doing everything he had to do.

TL: And the girl, I don't know her name, I forgot her name.

RH: Surriera.

TL: Yeah.

RH: Yeah.

TL: She was doing everything she has...



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RH: OK.

TL: ...to do too. She always asks about the baby, they were really caring.

RH: Did you, I'm sorry, did you ever ask them to call a Lieutenant at all or?

TL: No because I didn't know that they were supposed, if they could do that and I didn't know if a Lieutenant was working

so...

RH: I mean they called medical, so that's...

TL: Yeah that's the best they could do.

RH: I just didn't know if you had ever asked if, hey could you call a Lieutenant.

TL: No, I never did that.

RH: OK, that's fine.

TL: I don't know anything about that.

RH: And that's fine.

TL: M-hmm.

RH: That's fine.

JB: So, I know the baby came early.

TL: M-hmm.

JB: And she was in the Nicu.

TL: Yeah.

JB: Um, did she have any complications apart from just a preterm?

TL: No.

TL: The only thing that was complicated for her was eating.

JB: Aww.

TL: She was eating, not eating a lot.

JB: She didn't want to eat.

TL: She didn't want to eat anything, but now...

JB: She want to come early but then she wanted to be lazy.

TL: Right, they don't want to eat anything. You could move in my stomach when I'm going to sleep, but now...



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JB: Right.

TL: ...you want sleep all this time. Come on, come on.

JB: OK. Thank you so much for your time.

TL: Your welcome.

JB: Do you have any questions of me?

TL: Um, is this a bad thing that I'm talking to you guys or no? Is it a good thing?

JB: No, no. Um, I work in the D-O-C, Health Services Unit.

TL: OK.

JB: And when something happens...

TL: Yeah.

JB: ...outside of the norm.

TL: Uh-huh.

JB: I try to look into it, to see how we could prevent it from happening again.

TL: OK. I just asking because, um, I want to make sure I'm talking to the right people and I'm not...

RH: Yeah, no, no, no, absolutely.

JB: Yeah.

RH: So, we represent the Department of Correction, but...

JB: D-O-C.

RH: ...our job is to make sure that something like this that happened...

JB: Never happens again.

RH: ...to you, never happens again.

TL: Yeah.

RH: And if something during the course of what happened to you, if somebody didn't do what they were supposed to do.

TL: M-hmm.

RH: It's our job to hold them accountable.

TL: Right.

JB: Right.

RH: So that's what we do.

TL: Yeah, I'm just...



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RH: It's a two-part thing, we want to make sure this never happens again...

TL: Yeah and then...

RH: ...going to make sure that if somebody didn't do what they were supposed to do...

TL: That they hold accountable.

RH: ...that their held accountable.

TL: Right.

JB: And this is also a good time to look at the system to see what needs to be changed.

RH: Yeah.

TL: Right. OK. Thank you.





SM - I didn't, I wasn't aware that it was Surriera on the phone, but I knew it was someone from that unit because Michelle stated, "I, I told you when, I told Officer Ortiz when he came down here burning the wheels off the wheel chair that there was not gonna be a baby born in your unit tonight. She's not in labor."

CH - Ok.

SM - And she reassured her that she had been a labor and delivery nurse for 14 years and she knew that the Inmate was not going to have a baby.

CH - Ok, perfect. And then at about 6:15 Ortiz called the unit. Did you answer the phone?

SM - I answered the phone. I think that he was probably a little nervous at that point and called my line instead of the nurses' line by accident. I don't know, but when I answered, he's like, "Oh my God, Maddox." Like he, I think he was looking for the nursing staff and he's like, "This Inmate is having blood clots." And I was like, "Oh my God, you probably should send her." You know, with my births, I experienced the same thing. So I was like, "You should send her, you should send her." And Michelle actually grabbed the phone from me and took over the conversation and told him that if there was blood clots the baby would be coming soon so there's no way there's blood clots. And within minutes, Officer Surriera was calling a Code White over the radio.

CH - Ok, do you remember any conversation that Michelle may have had with either of the other nurses at that point?

SM - No, I don't even, I wasn't aware of the other nurse in the unit, because Michelle was with, on that side in 4 South all night. The other nurse was back and forth between 4 South and 4 North. So, I didn't even realize who the other nurse was until they all went running to the Code.

CH – Ok, after the Code was over, were you there when they came back?

SM – No, I wasn't.

CH - Ok.

SM - It was at the end of shift.

CH - So you didn't speak to any of the nurses after the fact?

SM - No, I never saw them because I went home for the day.

CH - So, do you have any general impression of how Michelle handled that incident that night?





SB: Mm.

RH: OK. You both get money coming in or you have money on your books regularly or?

SB: Yeah

RH: OK. Good. Um, so it wasn't, you weren't, didn't feel like you were having to support or anything like that?

SB: No.

RH: No, OK. Did she, uh, regular visits?

SB: She hasn't gotten any since I've been there.

RH: No visits?

SB: I haven't gotten any ei---, well just my daughter came to see me, but...

RH: OK. Does she use the phone at all?

SB: M-hmm.

RH: She uses the phone?

SB: She talks to her mom.

RH: Do you know how many times, say, once a day, once a week, do you know how many times she, she...

SB: She probably talks to her mom probably like two or three times a day if she answers.

RH: OK. OK. Um, and how about on the unit, she have a lot of friends on the unit?

SB: Yeah, everybody loves her cause you know, that's the only excitement really on the tier and you know when somebody got a new beginning coming...

RH: Yeah, yeah.

SB: So...

RH: Yup. OK.

SB: And everybody liked her...

RH: So, she was well liked?

SB: ...there was always baby stomach rubbing...

RH: Yeah.

SB: That stuff.

RH: OK. Alright. Alright and, uh, you said you've been in the cell with her for two months. How long have you been in the unit?

SB: I've been in the unit probably like, for, since September.



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RH: Since September?

SB: Mm. For like, right before my birthday.

RH: OK. So, um, you got to the unit before she did?

SB: Yes.

RH: When she got to the unit, were you her only cell mate? Or was she in the different cell?

SB: She had another cell mate but they left to go home.

RH: OK.

SB: I forgot her, um, her name.

RH: And then when her cell mate left to go home, did you move into the cell with her or did she move in with you?

SB: I moved in the cell with her.

RH: You moved in with her.

SB: Thing is, UM, she swapped us out. Well.

RH: When you say she, you mean the Unit Manager?

SB: Yeah, she coordinates the ...

RH: Who is the Unit Manager?

SB: Um, Jill Sandora.

RH: Is she a Counselor Supervisor?

SB: Yes, she's a supervisor, if you want to say that.

RH: So, Counselor Supervisor Sandora moved you into the cell with Ms. Laboy?

SB: Yeah and then...

RH: OK.

SB: ... Vanessa in the room with her.

RH: OK.

SB: Into the new room, the one I was in the room with, I guess she felt that it was a better match.

RH: OK. Alright. Um, so, what happened last night?

SB: Last night she kept calling, she kept calling, she called down a few times to go to medical.

RH: OK. So, let me, so, as far as the time frame, when I say last night she kept calling. Was this, um, early this morning, was it last night, 10 o'clock, 11 o'clock, last night?

SB: Like last night, 10 o'clock, 11 o'clock last night.



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RH: So...

SB: She went the first time ...

RH: And when you say she kept calling, she was calling the Officers as they were touring or she was using the intercom?

SB: The intercom, yeah.

RH: So, she kept calling on the intercom?

SB: M-hmm.

RH: Into the Officers...

SB: Yeah. Or sometimes when they come down to do rounds.

RH: Yup. And what was she complaining about?

SB: That she was having this baby tonight and nobody believed her.

RH: OK. Um, she was telling the Officers she was gonna have the baby and you said they weren't believing her? What were they telling her back?

SB: Because when she called, when she's been calling them like a lot. It's not like she has been just calling a little, she's been calling a lot. For, because she was having braxton hicks. But it's her first child, sometimes you can't tell the difference.

RH: Sure. Nervous mother, right?

SB: M-hmm.

RH: Right. OK.

SB: So as different things were going on, I started telling her well maybe you might need to press the button now because now you have bright blood. Cause, um, I came down to use the bathroom and she had been on the toilet for while so when she finally got off the toilet, I wanted to use it in that little bit of time. But I stepped on some blood, so, I felt something, a squish under my feet and I know there's nothing supposed to be squishy under the feet in the cell cause there's nothing. So, I turned on the light to see what it was and she had a puddle of blood on the floor. So, I told her to push the button cause the blood is bright red now. It's not like it, mucus, before they were saying it's the mucus plug. But it wasn't the mucus plug this time and I'm thinking that maybe she was in labor.

RH: OK.

SB: But I'm thinking, they were gon--, she was saying that the lady from O-B, this was like later, um, fast forwarding a little, almost like early morning now she said she has to wait for O-B-G-Y-N to come in because she's not, um, trained to do that.

RH: OK. Hold on a second.

SB; If it's the lady who I know she, if it's the lady who I know that it is, she's not trained to do O-B-G-Y-N.

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RH: OK.

SB: And at the time of the morning that it was, it was accu-check and all kinds of stuff like that.

RH: So, when you say that lady, was this just the nurse relayed to Ms. Laboy that she wasn't trained to do that? SB: No, they don't, we don't speak directly to the nurse from the room so it's like the C-Os are like the middle man.

RH: So, what, OK. So, at, so, last night...

SB: M-hmm.

RH: ...she had been calling a bunch of times...

SB: M-hmm.

RH: ...um, and then you went to the bathroom, you noticed there was some blood on the floor, it was different from before, it was bright red, there was some squishy, so there was some tissue and what not... SB: Yes.

RH: OK. And then was she taken to medical at any point last night?

SB: Um, she went about, I don't have a watch...

RH: No that's ok.

SB: So, like between 10 and 11. So it was around change of shift...

SB: ...that she went the first time. They gave her some ice and they gave her, um, uh, compress, a hot compress and just told her to eat some ice and take it easy because it's the Braxton Hicks, she's just got to try to relax, try to relax.

RH: How long was she gone for?

SB: She was probably, um, she came back probably 1 o'clock.

RH: She came back around 1?

SB: I remember we asked what time it was and they said it was 1 o'clock.

RH: OK. Was she upset when she came back?

SB: No, she felt a little better. But then they started coming back...

SB: Cause, of course they weren't Braxton Hicks, we were thinking they were Braxton Hicks and they're not. They was actually the real thing.

RH: OK. SB: Um.

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RH: OK, and then, um, how many times do you think you used the, the intercom last night to try and say hey, she really is having some kind of labor?

SB: I know it's like 4 times with the intercom and then like two or three times she tried to stop them. Ortiz always stopped and checked on her anyway. The other lady did too. She would just check on her, but when she called, when he called, she tells them can you call medical. Then when I keep saying that she called. When she tells them to call medical, can you call medical and tell the nurse I need to come over and see her because this is going on and that is going on and then she will be back in with the message was relayed back from the nurse.

RH: OK.

SB: So, she was like tell her I can't wait 15 minutes. And then the baby came within that 15 minutes.

RH: OK.

SB: Shit, they even had me going, I was drifting off like oh my god. All night I've been trying to go to sleep and then I wake up to some more screams. And I'm like it can't be that bad, they only Braxton Hicks, they even had me going.

RH: Oh my god.

SB: So, she was no I think this baby is coming today. Well before she was having a lot of issues with it, so everybody was like she's not having it today, she's not due for a whole 'nother month. But, baby, I did tell her, I said I think your baby is gonna come a little sooner then, um, what they expected them to.

RH: I guess they come when they want to come out, right? I'm interested, I want to back you up, when you said, you were saying that, um, uh, that she had to wait for the O-B-G-Y-N to come in because she wasn't trained to do, what are you saying she wasn't trained to do? And when you say she, are you talking about the nurse that was there that night?

SB: Because the other nurse, if they don't specialize in O-B-G-Y-N...

RH: M-hmm.

SB: ...they can't. All she can do is keep calling the nurse that is on call.

RH: Yup.

SB: I'm just telling you that from what I know.

RH: Yup. Yup.

SB: Working in that field. That she just had to call. But she, there not supposed to tell the patient that, but I know how to read in between the lines without actually telling her that. I just in the situation that it was, I didn't put myself as an inmate, I put myself as a...

RH: Sure.

SB: ...professional at work. So, when she was, that's how I read in between the lines that she wasn't, she you know, she just kept, was buying time, buying time until the lady get there. Cause they call back in and they was like just tell her to hold on, she'll be here in like 15 minutes and I guess that was her E-T-A for the amount of time that it will take for her to get here from wherever the nurse was at.

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RH: Yup.

SB: But she, she needs to be able, if she wanted to check her she needed to be able to know how to do a vaginal, a vaginal exam. And if she's only there for general stuff like finger sticks...

RH: Right, Right.

SB: ...and stuff like that. It takes a little more expertise for her to do that and I think Machinski, Machinski and Diane Carter are the only two that are, that are really specialized in that...

RH: OK.

SB: Cause its only like two or three nurses that I see in there. I think it was just a lack of communication. That's all.

RH: Lack of communication between, um, between Ms. Laboy and the Nurse, or between the Nurse and Doctors, or?

SB: I think it was just how, I think because she had been going, she always pushes the buzzer so I can honestly say...

RH: Do you think she was kind of like a crying wolf type thing? Like she can't...

SB: Yeah. That's what I thought, I wanted to tell her, what, I don't think she was just crying wolf, I think she was just nervous about the whole thing. Cause she doesn't have her paperwork ready. Her paperwork for her daughter going to her mom when she leave. They haven't did her paperwork yet. So, she's been worried about, worried about that, worried about that. So, since they were messing up on that, she's been worried about everything.

RH: OK.

SB: So, like her anxiety level has been up and she's an anxious person anyway. That's like, um, I would want to say a diagnosis for her because she had anxiety. Cause she, she cuts...

RH: Oh, OK.

SB: ...she cuts. So...

RH: Have you ever noticed her doing that, any of that?

SB: She like, she never does it when she's in the room with me. I've seen it on her, but I haven't seen it on her recently. Like any fresh scars or anything like that.

RH: OK. Was she, uh, being seen regularly by a Mental Health provider?

SB: Uh, yeah. That's who, that's who Jill is. Just the supervisor, social....

RH: Jill...

SB: ...she's the social worker for that unit.

RH: Oh, OK. OK. Um, so she was just really anxious because. So, her paperwork for when she gave birth wasn't, in place...

SB: M-hmm.

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RH: ...for the, uh, for her mother to take custody of her child that when. So that was making her anxious?

SB: Yeah.

RH: OK.

SB: She was, they were, they were working on it.

RH: When is that usually, how, when is that usually taken care of?

SB: It is usually done way sooner but they didn't have the person doing it. But I think Jill mother does it now.

RH: OK.

SB: Jill mother does it now. She, um, volunteered basically to come in and do it. So, I, because she's retired. But, she, um, she stepped in and she started doing it. But they just haven't gotten to it yet.

RH: Hmm.

SB: So that's alright, guess she was like I think this baby is coming tonight. I was like no I think it's just the Braxton Hicks. I think you just need to calm down, you even had me [??]. Calm down a little bit. She's like no, the baby is coming tonight.

RH: Let me ask you this, do you think, um, the Officers in the unit were ignoring her, at all?

SB: One and not the other. One would stop and the other one, well, she was, it's more like, you know how like sometimes you have to talk to the opposite sex to get things...

RH: Yeah, yep, yep.

SB: ...not get things done. For some reason, I don't know what it is, the communication is different. Like women are harder on women then it is like if you wanted, like if you wanted to get something done and you talk better to the women then to the man, I don't know.

RH: So, your saying Officer Ortiz would stop regularly?

SB: M-hmm.

RH: OK. And who was the other Officer?

SB: The other Officer, she would stop too, but...

RH: What was her name?

SB: I don't know her name.

RH: OK. So, Ortiz would stop, the other would stop but not really.

SB: Yeah...

RH: OK.

SB: ...she would stop, but she wasn't as, um, what word...

RH: Concerning? Or, uh, caring?

SB: Not, yeah, not as concerned as caring, she would check but it wasn't as sincere.



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RH: OK. OK.

SB: But when she had the baby, she was like the head is coming out. She was like really, the head is coming out. That woke me up right then and there...

SB: ...and I'm like and there's water in the toilet, so I'm like I got the towel, I need you to help me. So, she stood up, grabbed the baby, so now, we both grabbed the baby and we both holding the baby to make sure the babies, the babies must of, you know how cold water goes from warm to cold real quick, once she had a little shock, then she started crying.

RH: OK. Unbelievable.

SB: I'm like it's going to be on its ok.

RH: OK.

SB: And she was like, you know was listen to, my voice was soothing her. She was just crying a little bit, not a lot.

RH: The baby or the mother?

SB: The baby, the mother was fine.

RH: Yeah, yeah, yeah.

SB: Cause I kept telling her your gonna be, your gonna appreciate all the pain after cause you will be happy when you see your baby after.

RH: Yeah.

SB: Like all the pain would be worth it.

RH: OK. How long did it take, um, medical staff to respond to the cell after, um, the realized...

SB: They came imm--, they came immediately after that.

RH: So, what do you say, in seconds? Within minutes...

SB: They were there within seconds because when, um, when me and her were talking like, oh shit, you are having a baby, well I'm just telling you what was said...

RH: OK. Yeah, yeah, yeah, no its fine.

SB: ...cause I think the thing was recording...



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RH: I would be saying more than that, my language would be a little worse than that.

SB: Yeah, so, um, that's on there too.

RH: OK.

SB: I don't know if it's on the speaker or not, but, they never beeped out of the room when we beeped in.

RH: OK.

SB: So, they heard all that...

RH: OK.

SB: ...coming in so they, everybody came down fast after that.

SB: Once they called the code, the response time was fast.

RH: OK. Did, um, did she actually get up and go to breakfast this morning?

SB: Yeah. I made her get up to go...

The Ambulance arrived on grounds at 6:50am, at 7:01am East Lyme Ambulatory staff arrived on scene. Inmate Laboy was able to stand and walked with the assistance of medical staff to the gurney. Inmate Laboy was secured to the gurney by ambulatory staff and the Infant child was placed in her arms. Restraints were not utilized during this transport because there were medical contradictions to their application. Inmate Laboy was secured in the gurney and an officer was assigned to ride in the ambulance. A chase vehicle was also assigned to this transport. The ambulance departed grounds at 7:15am in route to Lawrence Memorial Hospital and escorted to the 4th Floor maternity ward at 7:40am. Update Inmate Laboy and the Infant child are admitted to the Lawrence Memorial Hospital no complications have been reported by escorting staff.

OVERVIEW

Background

Vanishing twin syndrome, first described by Stoeckel in 1945, is the identification of a multifetal gestation with subsequent disappearance of one or more fetuses. The rate of multifetal gestation at conception is higher than the incidence noted at birth. [1] Vanishing twin syndrome has been diagnosed more frequently since the use of ultrasonography in early pregnancy. [2, 3] In vitro fertilization techniques have improved the understanding of vanishing twin syndrome because these pregnancies are closely monitored, and the number of implanted fertilized eggs is known. [4]

In vanishing twin syndrome, there may be complete reabsorption of a fetus, formation of a fetus papyraceus (ie, a "mummified" or compressed fetus), or development of a subtle abnormality on the placenta such as a cyst, subchorionic fibrin, or amorphous material. [5]

The timing of this event significantly affects the outcome of the viable twin and the maternal complications. For example, if the event occurs during the second half of pregnancy, the fetus could develop cerebral palsy or cutis aplasia, and the mother could develop preterm labor, infection, puerperal hemorrhage, consumptive coagulopathy, or obstruction of labor. [6,

Pathophysiology

Abnormalities that result in the disappearance of a fetus usually appear to be present from early in development rather than occurring from an acute insult. Placental or fetal analysis frequently reveals chromosome abnormalities. These abnormalities include diploidy, triploidy, and alternate sex chromosome results on placental pathology, skin biopsies, and chorionic villus sampling. [8, 9, 10, 11] Study findings of the viable twin chromosomes in these reports are normal. Therefore, it is thought that the vanished twin had a chromosomal abnormality resulting in disappearance.

Epidemiology

Frequency

United States

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The frequency of multiple gestations is 3.3-5.4% at 8 weeks' gestation. ^[1] Vanishing twin syndrome occurs in 21-30% of multifetal gestation. ^[4]

Research from a European series of pregnancies associated with assisted reproductive technology (ART) show that 10-15% of singleton births were initially twin gestations.

International

International prevalence is similar to that of the United States.

Mortality/Morbidity

Maternal first-trimester morbidity

Morbidity when vanishing twin syndrome occurs during the first trimester is limited. The mother is most likely to develop mild vaginal bleeding and cramping. If the event occurs later in the first trimester, morbidity may be similar to that of the second and third trimesters.

Maternal morbidity in the second and third trimesters

Maternal complications include premature labor, infection from a retained fetus, severe puerperal hemorrhage, consumptive coagulopathy, and obstruction of labor by a low-lying fetus papyraceus causing dystocia and leading to a cesarean delivery. ^[6]

The diagnosis of vanishing twin in a pregnancy significantly increases both preterm (< 37 gestational weeks) and very preterm (< 32 gestational weeks) births. [6]

Fetal morbidity and mortality

In addition to loss of a twin, the surviving fetus has an increased risk of cerebral palsy, particularly if vanishing twin syndrome occurred during the second half of pregnancy. [12]

Other forms of morbidity reported in the surviving twin are aplasia cutis or areas of skin necrosis. In twins connected through vascular connection by placental anastomoses, temporary hypotension in the surviving twin at the time of fetal demise of the vanishing twin leads to poor perfusion and skin necrosis. [13]

Complications

Prematurity

Singleton pregnancies that were reduced to singleton because of vanishing twin syndrome are more likely to be delivered preterm (35.1 vs. 38.2 wk, P =0001). These rates of preterm delivery are similar to twin IVF pregnancies (23%). [14] In one series, singletons remaining after a vanishing twin event were associated with very premature birth (< 32 wk estimated gestational age). [15]

Low birth weight/small for gestational age

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Singleton pregnancies that were reduced to singleton because of vanishing twin syndrome are at higher risk for growth restriction (32.6% vs 16.3% of control IVF singleton pregnancies). ^[16] Risks associated with intrauterine growth restriction include increased morbidity and mortality in the neonatal period and increased rates of hospitalization in the neonatal intensive care unit.

Cerebral palsy

Researchers proposed that vanishing twin syndrome could result in spastic cerebral palsy in the remaining twin. (Cerebral palsy is the most common hypothesized pathological clinical sequela in the viable twin.) [12]

A possible mechanism is the transfusion of thromboplastic proteins from the vanishing twin to the surviving twin, leading to disseminated intravascular coagulation (DIC). Researchers hypothesize that DIC results from reverse blood flow from the macerated twin to the viable twin, thus carrying thromboplastins into the circulation. This large thromboplastin load is hypothesized to lead to a state of DIC in the viable twin, which then leads to intrauterine central nervous system damage. [17]

Another proposed mechanism for central nervous system damage involves large amounts of blood loss from the surviving twin to the low resistance system of the vanishing twin through placental anastomoses. This transfusion could cause wide fluctuation in intravascular pressures, leading to intraventricular hemorrhage that results in cerebral palsy. [18]

Cerebral impairment in the survivor has also been linked to confirmed cases of vanishing twin with impairment on the Griffiths Mental and Developmental Scales and Optimality score (relative risk 6.1 p=0.03). [18]

Associated congenital anomalies

A link in children with cerebral palsy and other congenital anomalies is possible. In one series, the relative risk for congenital malformations, including microcephaly, isolated hydrocephaly, eye, cleft lip/palate, and cardiac anomalies, increased over baseline from relative risk 3.1-116 (95% CI, 1.9-4.8 to 84 to 162.3; P< 0.01 to P< 0.0001) depending on the specific defect. ^[19] These anomalies are postulated to be due in part to perturbations in fetal flow in the surviving twin at the time of loss of the vanishing twin. ^[19]

Cutis aplasia

The mechanism of development of cutis aplasia is most likely vascular. There is thought to be decreased perfusion to the affected area at the time of demise of the vanished twin. Most case reports include a fetus papyraceous as the vanished twin. [13, 20]

Other complications

Preterm birth of the surviving twin has been described with a 2.3-fold increased risk and a mortality rate that is 3-fold increased. [21, 22]

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The surviving singleton infant after a twin vanishes has been shown to have a lower birth weight (mean difference, 368 g) than singleton pregnancies. [23]

Race

No predilection for any race has been reported.

Sex

No predilection for either sex has been reported in the vanishing twin.

Age

Researchers report more cases in women older than 30 years. Advanced maternal age is also a recognized risk factor for fetal and placental chromosome abnormalities.

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

What is preterm labor?

Preterm labor is defined as regular contractions of the uterus resulting in changes in the cervix that start before 37 weeks of pregnancy. Changes in the cervix include effacement (the cervix thins out) and dilation (the cervix opens so that the fetus can enter the birth canal).

What is preterm birth?

When birth occurs between 20 weeks of pregnancy and 37 weeks of pregnancy, it is called preterm birth

Why is preterm birth a concern?

Preterm birth is a concern because babies who are born too early may not be fully developed. They may be born with serious health problems. Some health problems, like cerebral palsy, can last a lifetime. Other problems, such as learning disabilities, may appear later in childhood or even in adulthood.

Which preterm babies are at greatest risk of health problems?

The risk of health problems is greatest for babies born before 34 weeks of pregnancy. But babies born between 34 weeks of pregnancy and 37 weeks of pregnancy also are at risk.

What are risk factors for preterm birth?

Factors that increase the risk of preterm birth include the following:

- Having a previous preterm birth
- Having a short cervix
- Short interval between pregnancies

- History of certain types of surgery on the uterus or cervix
- Certain pregnancy complications, such as multiple pregnancy and vaginal bleeding
- Lifestyle factors such as low prepregnancy weight, smoking during pregnancy, and substance abuse during pregnancy

Can anything be done to prevent preterm birth if I am at high risk?

If you have had a prior preterm birth and you are planning another pregnancy, a preconception care checkup can help you get in the best possible health before you become pregnant. When you become pregnant, be sure to start **prenatal care** early. You may be referred to a health care professional who has expertise in managing high-risk pregnancies. In addition, you may be given certain medications or other treatment to help prevent preterm birth if you have risk factors. Treatment is given based on your individual situation and your risk factors for preterm birth.

What are the signs and symptoms of preterm labor and what should I do if I have any of them?

Call your obstetrician or other health care professional right away if you notice any of these signs or symptoms:

- Change in type of vaginal discharge (watery, mucus, or bloody)
- Increase in amount of discharge
- Pelvic or lower abdominal pressure
- Constant low, dull backache
- Mild abdominal cramps, with or without diarrhea
- Regular or frequent contractions or uterine tightening, often painless
- Ruptured membranes (your water breaks with a gush or a trickle of fluid)

How is preterm labor diagnosed?

Preterm labor can be diagnosed only when changes in the cervix are found. Your obstetrician or other health care professional may perform a *pelvic exam* to see if your cervix has started to change. You may need to be examined several times over a period of a few hours. Your contractions also may be monitored.

Your obstetrician or other health care professional may do certain tests to determine whether you need to be hospitalized or if you need immediate specialized care. A *transvaginal ultrasound* exam may be done to measure the length of your cervix. The level of a protein called *fetal fibronectin* in the vaginal discharge may be measured. The presence of this protein is linked to preterm birth.

If I have preterm labor, will I have a preterm birth?

It is difficult for health care professionals to predict which women with preterm labor will go on to have preterm birth. Only about 10% of women with preterm labor will give birth within the next 7 days. For about 30% of women, preterm labor stops on its own.

What happens if my preterm labor continues?

If your preterm labor continues, how it is managed is based on what is thought to be best for your health and your baby's health. When there is a chance that the baby would benefit from a delay in delivery, certain medications may be given. These medications include *corticosteroids*, *magnesium sulfate*, and *tocolytics*.

What are corticosteroids?

Corticosteroids are drugs that cross the *placenta* and help speed up development of the baby's lungs, brain, and digestive organs. Corticosteroids are most likely to help your baby when they are given between 24 weeks of pregnancy and 34 weeks of pregnancy, but consideration can also be given to providing corticosteroids between 23 and 24 weeks of pregnancy.

What is magnesium sulfate?

Magnesium sulfate is a medication that may be given if you are less than 32 weeks pregnant, are in preterm labor, and are at risk of delivery within the next 24 hours. This medication may help reduce the risk of cerebral palsy that is associated with early preterm birth.

What are tocolytics?

Tocolytics are drugs used to delay delivery for a short time (up to 48 hours). They may allow time for corticosteroids or magnesium sulfate to be given or for you to be transferred to a hospital that offers specialized care for preterm infants. In addition to its role in protecting against cerebral palsy, magnesium sulfate also can be used as a tocolytic drug.

What happens if my labor does not stop?

If your labor does not stop and it looks like you will give birth to your baby early, you and the baby usually will be cared for by a team of health care professionals. The team may include a **neonatologist**, a doctor who specializes in treating problems in newborns. The care your baby needs depends on how early he or she is born. High-level neonatal intensive care units provide this specialized care for preterm infants.

Glossary

*Cerebral Palsy: A long-term disability of the nervous system that affects young children in which control of movement or posture is abnormal and is not the result of a recognized disease.

Cervix: The lower, narrow end of the uterus at the top of the vagina.

Corticosteroids: Hormones given to help fetal lungs mature, for arthritis, or for other medical conditions.

Fetal Fibronectin: A protein that helps the amniotic sac stay connected to the inside of the uterus.

Fetus: The developing organism in the uterus from the ninth week of pregnancy until the end of pregnancy.

Magnesium Sulfate: A drug that may help prevent cerebral palsy when it is given to women in preterm labor who are at risk of delivery before 32 weeks of pregnancy.

Neonatologist: A doctor who specializes in the diagnosis and treatment of disorders that affect newborn infants.

Pelvic Exam: A physical examination of a woman's reproductive organs.

Placenta: Tissue that provides nourishment to and takes waste away from the fetus.

Prenatal Care: A program of care for a pregnant woman before the birth of her baby.

Tocolytics: Drugs used to slow contractions of the uterus.

Transvaginal Ultrasound: A type of ultrasound in which a device specially designed to be placed in the vagina is used.

Uterus: A muscular organ located in the female pelvis that contains and nourishes the developing embryo and fetus during pregnancy.



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


